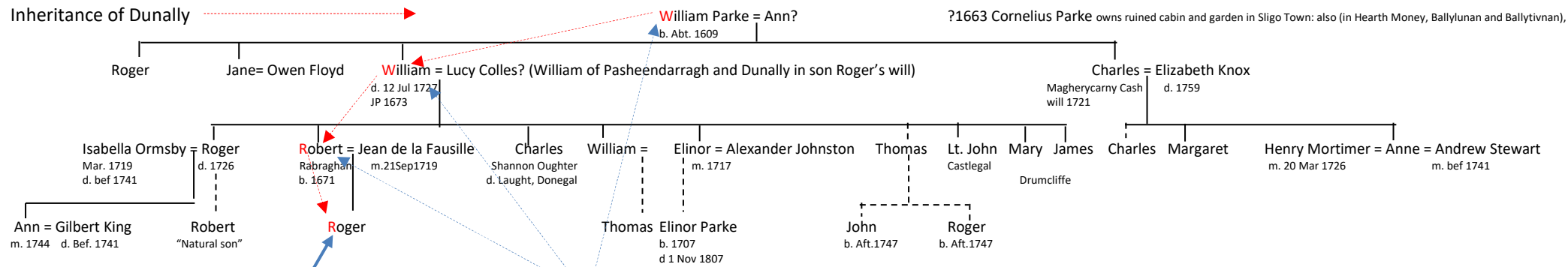


Inheritance of Dunally



Could these be the same Roger? If Robert married Jean in 1719, his son Roger could have been born between 1720 and 1725 – the latter date would still allow for Robert's brother Roger to mention him in his will. This, however, would mean that Lt Col Roger was over 90 years old when he died and ~50 when he married Alice Bown and started having children with her. Was there another generation between these 2 Rogers, or did Lt Col Roger live to an advanced age?

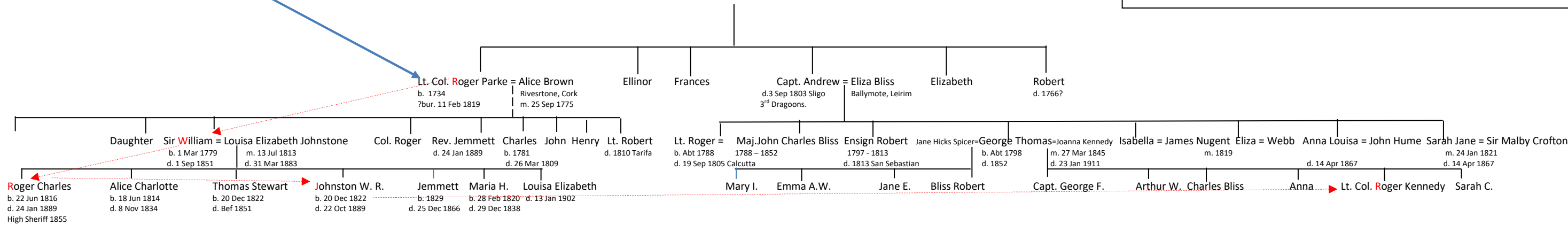
*Note: Drumcliffe Church Burials:
Roger Parke of Dunally buried 11 Feb 1819 aged 85 years i.e. born 1734
 This supports the belief that they are one-and-the-same Roger.

← Perceived problems with these trees →

If William (married Ann) and William (married Lucy) were the grandfather and father of Robert (married Jean de la Fausille), then Robert's father must have lived to an advanced age. Presumably, Robert was born around 1689-99 and his brother Roger was born around 1685-95, which would imply that their father William married around 1685. This means that either, or both, their grandfather and father married later in life – **it appears that there are 80 years between the births of grandfather and grandsons!**

Will of Roger Parke 1726
 To my wife Isabella Ormsby an annuity of 80 pounds
 Mentions his father William Parke of Dunally and Pasheendarragh
 To Ann Parke, my daughter, 600 pounds and much land – to descend to Roger Parke, son of my brother Robert Parke of Rabrahane
 Falling him to Charles Parke my second brother.
 Then to my third brother William Parke
 Then to my cousin Edward Parke
 Then to my cousin Francis Parke
 Then to my sister Mary Parke
 Then to Elinor Parke, daughter of my eldest sister Elinor Parke.
 To my natural son Robert Parke 50 pounds

- 1711 Memorial #44677 8th and 9th January Lease and release of lands from William Parke (Castlecarr, Leitrim) to William Parke (Dunally, Sligo). Witnesses: Roger Parke, Charles Parke and Robert Parke (gents) of Dunally and Thomas Parke, gent. of Sevanough
- 1717 Indenture of lease. Memorial #31624 between Alexander Johnston of Leitrim and Roger Parke of Dunally. Witnessed by Roger and his father William Parke.
- 1719 Memorial #31620 27 August 1719 between Mr William Parke of Dunally, Sligo for and on behalf of his son and heir Roger Parke and Mathew Ormsby of Rathlee for and on behalf of his daughter Isabella Ormsby to be married on or before 28 August 1719
- 1719 Memorial #15288 Deeds of Lease and Release. 7th & 8th October 1719 between Edward Parke of Castlecarr in the county of Leitrim, esq., of the one part and Robert Parke of Dunally in the County of Sligo of the other part. Witnessed by Roger Parke, Charles Parke and James Parke all of Dunally aforesaid gents brothers of the said Robert Parke.
- 1719/25 Memorial of Lease/Release 14/15 June 1725, #74023. Sworn at Quarterly Sessions in Sligo on 15 January 1741
 A=William Parke, Dunally; B=Robert Parke, his 2nd son; C=Richard Gore and John Fontanier; D=Thomas Osborne
 On 21 Sep 1719, A and B received 400stg from C intended to be a marriage settlement for Jean to B. John Fontanier^c was guardian of Jean De La Fausille.
- 1720 Thomas Parke (Pasheendarragh, Drumcliffe, Sligo) demised, to Robert Hunter for 1 pound per annum, land formerly belonging to Elizabeth Parke for his sons John and Roger and also for Thomas Parke son of the late William (Dunally)
- 1720 Will of Charles Parke (Magherycarnycash, Sligo) 6 December 1720 for 30 March 1722. Widow Elizabeth Knox. Daughters Margery and Anne
- 1725 William Parke (Dunally) leasing lands to son Charles (Shannon Eighter). Witnessed by William, son of William and brother to Charles.
- 1726 Will of Roger Parke, Dunally. Widow Isabella Ormsby. Daughter Anne married Gilbert King.
- 1726 William Parke, Esq. (Dunally) has 'heir apparent' Robert Parke (gent)(Rabraghan). They lease land to William's next son, Charles Parke (gent) of Shannoneighter.
- 1741 15th February 1741. Both Robert Parke (Rabraghan) and William Parke (Dunally) are deceased, but Sir Richard Gethin attests that he witnessed them signing the deed of 1719/25
- 1749 Census of Sligo: Thomas (wigmaker); James (farmer); Robert (glazier); Roger (landowner)



1758 Charles Parke, weaver of Legevavy (Legevany?)

1768 Thomas Parke, potter of Pasheendarragh Sligo: sons John and Roger and Thomas son of late William, Dunally

In 1774 Roger Parke of Cooladrummin, Drumcliff signed a deed with James Rutledge of Cornstalk, Leitrim. Is this Thomas Parke's son?

In 1800 there is an Andrew Parke in the town of Sligo
